The Marlow Community Choir - a four-part choir of more than 100 singers which meets regularly under the baton of their Director of Music, Gillian Dibden MBE - have used the winter months to warm up their vocal chords in preparation for their concert performance of baroque music, on Saturday 30 January.

Handel's four *Coronation Anthems*, composed for the coronation of King George II and Queen Caroline in 1727, are on the programme along with the *Gloria* (Gloria in excelsis Deo, 1715),

Vivaldi's most famous choral piece. The concert venue is the recently restored All Saints Church, Boyn Hill in Maidenhead.

On Wednesday 10 February, the Choir will start working on their next project – the summer concert for the Wycombe Arts Festival on Wednesday 19 May (details available on request) –so it's an opportunity for newcomers to join, especially tenors and basses.

Wednesday rehearsals, 7.30 to 9pm during school terms at Sir William Borlase School. There are no auditions, the principle being that if you enjoy it, you'll be motivated to learn and develop your singing skill, whatever your level of experience.
