	Ref. 17/02680/APP - Old Kilns, Back Street, Thornborough, B MK18 2DH -	
	Demolition of redundant building and erection of one dwelling with detached	
	outbuilding. Proposed Cllr MT, seconded Cllr MS that Thornborough Parish	
	Council OBJECT to this application on the following grounds:	
	Curtilage Issues.	
	In accordance with Thornborough Parish Council's response to the application	
	16/00973/COUAR for the barn, we do not wish to see the envelope of the village	
	extended. Thornborough Parish Council is concerned that although the Council	
	made no objection to the previous COUAR application, the granting of a new build	
	outside the village envelope in the open countryside would set a precedent for	
	future applications for new builds. Thornborough Parish Council believe that the	
	re-development of a dilapidated farm building that is currently an eyesore as a	
	house is very different situation to the development of a new build in the countryside. Thornborough Parish Council also believe that the position of the	
	proposed house could allow a possibility of infilling with further new houses built in	
	the resulting extended area of the village.	
	Design	
	The design for the new building submitted is not in keeping with the surrounding	
	environment. It does not conform to the Adopted Aylesbury Vale District Local	
	Plan (AVDLP), essentially GP 35 -The design of new development proposals, and	
	also RA1, RA2, RA3, RA13 and RA14. The proposed development is over-	
	bearing, out-of-scale and out of character in terms of its appearance compared	
	with existing development in the vicinity and therefore not in conformance with	
	AVDC's design guidelines 'New Buildings in the Countryside' 3.01, 3.06, 4.06,	
	7.04 and 9.02	
	Traffic on Back Street	
	Thornborough Parish Council are concerned that this application, given the size of	
	the house and the space allocated for the parking of a minimum of 5 cars, could	
	give rise to much increased traffic in Back Street, and that if a precedent was set	
	and more houses were built as infill, this would greatly exacerbate the problem.	
	Back Street is already deteriorating at a faster rate than Buckinghamshire County	
	Council Highways can maintain it, as a lane that is in many places only one	
	vehicle wide it cannot support increased traffic.	
	Moving the Footpath Thornborough Parish Council appreciate that this is not something that Aylesbury	
	Vale District Council can give permission for but would like to register a future	
	objection should a separate application to move the footpath be made to	
	Buckinghamshire County Council. The proposal to move Right of Way THB/12	
	which has been established over 100s of years and is still widely used by many	
	local people is wholly unacceptable. Thornborough Parish Council can see no

	good reason for its re-siting. There are many houses and farms in the village and		
	surrounding countryside that are situated immediately adjacent to Rights of Way,		
	or even have a Right of Way go through their property, and security has never		
	been cited by other householders as an issue, Thornborough Parish Council		
	believe that local history is often delineated by the footpath network and that for		
	historical reasons footpaths and Rights of Way should not be moved unless there		
	is a very good reason and this application does not present one. Thornborough		
	Parish Council also understand that the owners of the land across which the new		
	position of the footpath is proposed, who attended this meeting, do not give		
	permission for this re-siting.		
	Agreed by 5 for, 1 abstention, none against.	Clerk to make	
	Therefore Thornborough Parish Council object to the proposal and for these	response	
	reasons ask that Aylesbury Vale District Council refuse this application.
